REVISIONS TO DISCIPLINES (MASTER’S)

PROPOSAL #1

Proposed Revision Discipline: Counseling
College: Napa Valley College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Master’s in counseling, rehabilitation counseling, clinical psychology, counseling psychology, guidance counseling, educational counseling, social work, or career development, **OR** The equivalent.

(NOTE: A license as a Marriage, Family, and Child Counselor is an alternative qualification for this discipline, pursuant to Title 5 Section 53410.1.)

Proposed Change:

(NOTE: A license as a ~~Marriage, Family, and Child Counselor~~ *Marriage and Family Therapist (MFT)* is an alternative qualification for this discipline, pursuant to Title 5 Section 53410.1.)

Summary Rationale:

The *California Board of Behavioral Sciences* changed the name of this professional title, license, and degree a few years ago. The title, Marriage, Family, and Child Counselor, is no longer used.

PROPOSAL #2

Proposed Revision Discipline: Human Services (New Discipline)
College: American River College

Current Minimum Qualification:

N/a (New Discipline)

Proposed Change:

*Master’s in human services, social work, counseling psychology, clinical psychology, counseling, or, **OR** the equivalent.*

Summary Rationale:

Human Services is a full transfer degree program offered at multiple California community colleges. The Academic Senate at Cosumnes River College, Sacramento City College, Folsom Lake College, Long Beach College, and the Los Rios Community College District have also approved this request for a Human Services discipline.

PROPOSAL #3

Proposed Revision Discipline: Physical Education
College: State Community College Organization of Physical Educators

Current Minimum Qualification:

Master's in physical education, *exercise science*, education with an emphasis in physical education, kinesiology, physiology of exercise, or adaptive physical education, **OR** Bachelor's in any of the above **AND** master's in any life science, dance, physiology, health education, recreation administration, or physical therapy **OR** The equivalent

Proposed Change:

Master's in physical education, exercise science/*wellness*, education with an emphasis in physical education, kinesiology, physiology of exercise, or adaptive physical education, *sport science, athletic training/sports medicine, or sport/fitness administration* **OR** Bachelor's in any of the above **AND** master's in any life science, dance, physiology, health education, recreation administration, or physical therapy **OR** the equivalent

Summary Rationale:

Many colleges and universities had expanded the discipline of physical education to include a broader array of Master Degrees.

PROPOSAL #4

Proposed Revision Discipline: Astronomy
College: Southwestern College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Master's in physics, astronomy, or astrophysics **OR** Bachelor's in physics or astronomy **AND** Master's in engineering, mathematics, meteorology, or geophysics *physics* **OR** The equivalent.

Proposed Change:

Create new discipline for Astronomy: Master's in astronomy or astrophysics **OR** *Bachelor's in astronomy* **AND** *Master's in physics,* **OR** *the equivalent.*

Summary Rationale:

Astronomy would be established as a new discipline, separate from the current discipline of Physics/Astronomy. Degrees in engineering, math, meteorology, geophysics, or physics alone, which currently satisfy the minimum qualifications for Physics/Astronomy, do not prepare an individual to teach core topics in contemporary astronomy at the college-level. These topics include stellar evolution, interstellar matter, degenerate objects, Galactic astronomy, galaxies, and cosmology, all of which are specific to astronomy and require formal education in the discipline to master. In addition, the MS and PhD in astronomy are degrees that are widely available throughout the United States and the State of California. The minimum qualifications for physics would remain unchanged.

PROPOSAL #5

Proposed Revision Discipline: Sociology
College: Mission College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Master's in sociology **OR** Bachelor's in sociology **AND** Master's in anthropology, any ethnic studies, social work, or psychology **OR** The equivalent

Proposed Change:

Master's in sociology **OR** Bachelor's in sociology **AND** Master's in anthropology, any ethnic studies, social work, or psychology, *history, political science, or social science* **OR** The equivalent

Summary Rationale:

The flexibility and interdisciplinary information necessary for the study of sociology requires greater expertise in these areas.

PROPOSAL #6

Proposed Revision Discipline: Nursing
College: Los Angeles Harbor

Current Minimum Qualification:

Nursing: Master's in nursing **OR** Bachelor's in nursing **AND** Master's in health education or health science **OR** The equivalent **OR** the minimum qualifications as set by the Board of Registered Nursing, whichever is higher

Proposed Change:

Registered Nursing: Master's in nursing **OR** Bachelor's in nursing **AND** Master's in health education or health science **OR** The equivalent **OR** the minimum qualifications as set by the Board of Registered Nursing, whichever is higher

Summary Rationale:

Three disciplines currently use the word "nursing" in the title. Faculty teaching RN programs require an MSN, while the LVN and Nursing Science/Clinical Practice require a BSN plus experience. The word *Registered* in front of "Nursing" would make clear that an MSN degree is required and would thereby reduce confusion, especially for colleges that list some of their RN courses as "Nursing Science" and those that refer to RN clinical sections as "Clinical Practice."

PROPOSAL #7

Proposed Revision Discipline: Psychology
College: Mendocino College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Master's in psychology **OR** Bachelor's in psychology **AND** Master's in counseling, sociology, statistics, neuroscience, or social work **OR** the equivalent

Proposed Change:

Master's in psychology *or counseling* **OR** Bachelor's in psychology **AND** master's in ~~counseling~~, sociology, ~~statistics~~, *psychobiology*, neuroscience, or social work **OR** the equivalent

Summary Rationale:

Today, most individuals who receive their master's degree in counseling from an accredited institution are qualified to teach a variety of community college-level psychology courses. Counseling degree programs, overall, have increased in rigor and consistency since the time when the current minimum qualifications were last revised. Moreover, those with BA degrees in a more diverse set of disciplines (beyond psychology) are choosing to shift direction at some point in their careers and return to school for their counseling master's degree. The proposed changes would, then, significantly increase and diversify the potential pool of qualified instructors from which the community colleges may seek the best applicants for their psychology positions. A master's in statistics is taken out because statistics, at the master's level, is of minor relevance to the *majority* of psychology courses at the community college level.

PROPOSAL #8

Proposed Revision Discipline: Speech Communication
College: Merritt College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Speech Communication: Master's in speech, speech broadcasting, telecommunications, rhetoric, communication, *communication studies*, speech communication, or organizational communication **OR** Bachelor's in any of the above **AND** master's in drama/theater arts, mass communication, or English **OR** the equivalent

Proposed Change:

Change the title to *Communication Studies*

Summary Rationale:

Both within the California state school system and at colleges nationwide, campuses have changed the department title of "Speech" or "Speech Communication" to "Communication" or "Communication Studies" in order to better represent the full field of study. The title "Speech Communication" implies that the courses in the major focus on oral communication only. In reality, this discipline is broader, including courses in behavioral sciences, critical thinking, theory, and other areas. This title change would

clarify the confusion caused by the title "Speech Communication," as well as allowing for maximum flexibility for the major.

PROPOSAL #9

Proposed Revision Discipline: Agriculture
College: Las Positas College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Master's in agriculture, agriculture sciences or education with a specialization in agriculture **OR** Bachelor's in any of the above **AND** Master's in agriculture business, natural resources, animal science, plant science, soil science, forestry, pomology, agricultural engineering, environmental horticulture, agronomy, or enology **OR** The equivalent.

Proposed Change:

Master's in agriculture, agriculture sciences or education with a specialization in agriculture **OR** Bachelor's in any of the above **AND** Master's in agriculture business, natural resources, animal science, plant science, soil science, forestry, pomology, agricultural engineering, environmental horticulture, agronomy, *viticulture* or enology **OR** The equivalent.

Summary Rationale:

A number of community colleges in the state, including Allan Hancock, Los Positas, Napa Valley, and Santa Rosa Junior College are now offering programs leading to degrees in viticulture. Additionally, a standardized statewide curriculum in California Community Colleges has been developed (and adopted) under the auspices of the CCC Statewide Agriculture Curriculum Project as a Viticulture Curriculum supplement to the CC Statewide Plant Science Curriculum. The standardized curriculum includes a degree track for Viticulture. The Project was supported by Carl D. Perkins Vocational Education Act, Title II, Part B funds administered by the Chancellor's Office. Also Viticulture, Enology, and Wine Business now have their own TOP Code. In the new 2004 Taxonomy of Programs published by the Chancellor's Office in February 2004.

PROPOSAL #10

Proposed Revision Discipline: Health
College: City College of San Francisco

Current Minimum Qualification:

Master's in health science, health education, biology, nursing, physical education, dietetics, or nutrition **OR** Bachelor's in any of the above **AND** Master's in public health, or any biological science **OR** The equivalent.

Proposed Change:

Master's in health science, health education, biology, nursing, physical education, dietetics, or nutrition, *Public Health, Social Work, Social Welfare, Counseling, or*

~~Medical Doctor OR Bachelor's in any of the above AND Master's in public health, or any biological science OR The equivalent.~~

Summary Rationale:

Due to the ever-broadening scope of the inter-disciplinary field of Health Science, the diversity of focus among Health Science Departments at Community Colleges in California, the academic and vocational needs of our students, and the frequent use of the equivalency process to hire qualified instructors, we propose broadening the minimum qualifications for Health Science to include professionals with educational degrees in Medicine (currently we can hire nurses, but physicians need to go through equivalency), Public Health, Social Work, Social Welfare, and Counseling.

PROPOSAL #11

Proposed Revision Discipline: Environmental Studies and Environmental Sciences
College: De Anza College

Current Minimum Qualification:

None

Proposed Change:

Masters in Environmental Studies, Biology, Geography, Meteorology, Environmental Compliance and Law, Environmental Science, Environmental Management, Environmental Policy, Environmental Engineering, Ecosystem Management **OR** the Equivalent.

Summary Rationale:

This discipline is currently included in Interdisciplinary Studies, which fails to adequately describe the discipline. Degrees at UC Santa Barbara, UC Davis, and San Jose State University are offered on university campuses throughout the country. Faculty with a broad range of experience will enhance the Environmental Studies courses, programs & departments.

PROPOSAL #12

Proposed Revision Discipline: Computer Graphics
College: Cypress College

Current Minimum Qualification:
None

Proposed Change:
Add “*Computer Graphics*” to Non-Master’s List.

Summary Rationale:
We have an art-computer graphics major and a multimedia major with no discipline codes for instructors in those fields.

PROPOSAL #13

Proposed Revision Discipline: 3-D Modeling
College: Cypress College

Current Minimum Qualification:
Bachelor’s degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience.

Proposed Change:
Add “*3-D Modeling*” to Non-Master’s List.

Summary Rationale:
We have a multimedia major and an Art Computer Graphics department without discipline codes in those areas. 3-D Modeling would be a related discipline.

PROPOSAL #14

Proposed Revision Discipline: Theater Performance
College: Cypress College

Current Minimum Qualification:
None

Proposed Change:
Add “*Theater Performance*” to Non-Master’s List.

Summary Rationale:

The best people to teach performance techniques are performers. They rarely go on to Master's programs because their performance lives are relatively short and it takes a long time to get established. This new discipline would not change the requirement that theoretical courses like Theater History and Introduction to Theatre be taught by instructors with master's degrees.

PROPOSAL #15

Proposed Revision Discipline: Dance Performance
College: Cypress College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Bachelor's degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience.

Proposed Change:

Add "Dance Performance" to Non-Master's List.

Summary Rationale:

The best people to teach performance techniques are performers. They rarely go on to Master's programs because their performance lives are relatively short and it takes a long time to get established. This new discipline would not change the requirement that theoretical classes like Dance History and Ethnic Influences in Dance be taught by instructors with master's degrees.

PROPOSAL #16

Proposed Revision Discipline: Community Planning and Economic Development
College: Los Angeles Trade Technical College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Bachelor's degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience.

Proposed Change:

*An advanced or professional degree in urban planning, public administration, social work or law **OR** a Bachelor's degree and two years of full-time experience in urban planning, public administration, sociology, social work, political science, environmental studies, community lending, affordable housing field and real estate development **OR** an Associate degree and six years of full-time experience in urban planning, public administration, sociology, social work, political science, environment studies, community lending, affordable housing field and real estate development, community lending or affordable housing.*

Summary Rationale:

The Community Planning and Economic Development Program is in its eighth year of operation. It is the only such program in the nation at a community college. It has permanent status from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office and the California Postsecondary Education Commission.

PROPOSAL #17

Proposed Revision Discipline: Nursing Science/Clinical Practice
College: Los Angeles Harbor College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Bachelor's degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience.

Proposed Change:

BSN required and a minimum of two years of experience with patients and RN licensure.

Summary Rationale:

The minimum qualifications for disciplines on the Non-Master's List are "Any bachelor's degree and two years of experience, or any associate degree and six years of experience." This minimum is not sufficient for hiring Nursing Science/Clinical Practice faculty, where faculty hired to teach these courses require a specific degree in a specific major, the BSN and RN licensure. Faculty with an "associate degree or bachelor's degree in any discipline" also would not qualify to teach these courses.

PROPOSAL #18

Proposed Revision Discipline: Mortgage Finance
College: Los Angeles Trade-Technical College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Bachelor's degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience.

Proposed Change:

*Advanced or professional degree in business, finance, banking, planning or law **OR** Any bachelor's degree **AND** two years of full-time experience in the mortgage finance, banking, community lending, affordable house field, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of full-time experience in the mortgage finance, banking, community lending, affordable housing or related field.*

Summary Rationale:

The Mortgage Finance Program is in its fourth year of operation. It is the only such program in the State of California. It received permanent status from the California

Community Colleges Chancellor's Office and the California Postsecondary Education Commission in May 2004.

PROPOSAL #19

Proposed Revision Discipline: Digital Media/Internet Services
College: West Valley College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Bachelor's degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience.

Proposed Change:

*Bachelor's degree from an accredited institution, or equivalent foreign degree, in a discipline directly related to the faculty member's assignment, plus two years of professional experience **OR** Associate degree from an accredited institution, or equivalent foreign degree, in a discipline directly related to the faculty member's assignment, plus six years professional experience.*

Summary Rationale:

The discipline of Digital Media/Internet Services is currently listed under CIS. Digital Media/Internet Services is a different discipline from CIS and should have its own list of minimum qualifications. Since the year 2000, students can receive an associate degree in Digital Media/Internet Services.

PROPOSAL #20

Proposed Revision Discipline: Computer Applications
College: West Valley College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Bachelor's degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience.

Proposed Change:

*Bachelor degree in Business Administration, Business Education, Computer Science or related fields and evidence of two years of successful teaching and work experience in the subject field or the equivalent such as web related applications **OR** an Associate's degree in Business Administration, Computer Applications, Computer Science or related fields and evidence of six years of successful teaching and work experience in the subject field or the equivalent such as web related applications.*

Summary Rationale:

Industry standards have increased and we need graduates who understand applications as well as how they relate to business practices and not all of our students obtain degrees. Some are small business owners and some are life-long learners. Currently, the way the

qualifications are written, someone in a non-related discipline could be hired. The qualifications are too open-ended and not defined. In order to keep up to the high standards of business, we need to adjust our standards to meet theirs. Our advisory boards have recommended that we prepare our students more for business practices and how the software relates to these practices.

PROPOSAL #21

Proposed Revision Discipline: Animal Health Technology
College: Los Angeles Pierce College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Bachelor's degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience.

Proposed Change:

Any bachelor's degree or any associate degree plus appropriate experience in ~~Animal Health Technology~~ Registered Veterinary Technology.

Summary Rationale:

In 1993, the State of California officially changed the name of the profession from Animal Health Technician to Registered Veterinary Technician. The reason behind the change was to reflect the difference between an individual who has been educated, passed a state board exam, and is registered from one who has no formal training and is not registered but has job training.

PROPOSAL #22

Proposed Revision Discipline: Radiological Sciences
College: Santa Barbara City College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Bachelor's degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience.

Proposed Change:

Bachelor's degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience **OR** *minimum standards as set by the Joint Review Committee of Education in Radiology.*

Summary Rationale:

The Joint Review Committee of Education in Radiology now requires that a Program Director Clinical Coordinator have as a minimum a Master's degree in any discipline and that the Clinical Coordinator have as a minimum a Bachelor's degree.

PROPOSAL #23

Proposed Revision Discipline: Auto Mechanics
College: Santa Barbara City College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Bachelor’s degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience.

Proposed Change:

Change the title to *Auto Technology*

Summary Rationale:

“Mechanics” is an old term that is not commonly used anymore; *technology* is the term that has replaced it. Since modern automobiles are very sophisticated, including electronics and computers, *technology* is more appropriate.

PROPOSAL #24

Proposed Revision Discipline: Licensed Vocational Nursing
College: Los Angeles Harbor College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Bachelor’s degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience.

Proposed Change:

Bachelor of Science in Nursing and recency working in a hospital in the last 5 years. (Requirements are set by the LVN Board and Board of Psychiatric Nursing).

Summary Rationale:

The minimum qualifications for any discipline not requiring a master’s degree are “Any bachelor’s degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience,” which are not sufficient for LVN faculty. Faculty hired to teach LVN courses require a specific degree, the BSN, and five years of experience. Also, faculty with an “associate degree in any discipline” could not qualify to teach LVN courses according to the requirements established by the LVN Board and the Board of Psychiatric Nursing.

PROPOSAL #25

Proposed Revision Discipline: Forensic Sciences: Administration of Justice
College: West Valley College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Bachelor’s degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience.

Proposed Change:

A bachelor's degree in forensic sciences, any of the biological sciences, or chemistry AND two years of experience in a crime laboratory or as a crime scene analyst.

Summary Rationale:

While forensic science is a well-established and critical discipline in law enforcement, there are no minimum qualifications for teaching the basic course in this discipline. The increasing use of scientific methods for solving crimes require knowledge and skills that go beyond the current skill set presented in crime scene investigation courses.

PROPOSAL #26

Proposed Revision Discipline: Addiction Paraprofessional Training
College: Diablo Valley College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Bachelor's degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience.

Proposed Change:

Any bachelor's degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience **AND** *appropriate certification to practice or licensure OR its equivalent.*

Summary Rationale:

California will soon require a minimum standard certification for anyone working in addiction treatment. This will be a major change in the field. The California State Office of Alcohol and Drug Program is only prescribing a minimum standards. Many facilities and organizations have much higher standards for employment; however, this state mandate will hold everyone to a least minimum standard.

The two main state organizations that award certificates are CAADE (California Association of Alcohol and Drug Educators) and CAADAC (California Association of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Counselors). Most of the community colleges that offer addiction certificates are academically preparing students to ultimately qualify for one of these certifications. It makes sense that when our own faculty do not possess a master's degree and/or other professional degree/licenses that, at a minimum, they should have the basic Non-Master's degree requirements, plus the state-recognized (soon to be required) certification.

PROPOSAL #27

Proposed Revision Discipline: Process Technology
College: Los Angeles Trade Technical College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Bachelor's degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience.

Proposed Change:

*Bachelor's degree in Chemistry or Chemical Engineering and two years of experience, **OR** an associate's degree in Chemical Technology and six years of experience.*

Summary Rationale:

A process technician is a key member of a team of people responsible for planning, analyzing, and controlling the production of products from the acquisition of raw materials through the production and distribution of products to customers in a variety of process industries. These industries include, but are not limited to, chemical, food and beverage, oil exploration and production, pharmaceuticals, power generation, pulp and paper, refining and wastewater treatment.

PROPOSAL #28

Proposed Revision Discipline: Drafting
College: Evergreen Valley College

Current Minimum Qualification:

Bachelor's degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience.

Proposed Change:

*Add to areas also included in the discipline: CADD (Computer Aided Drafting/Design) **OR** CAD (Computer Aided Design) **OR** CAD (Computer Aided Drafting)*

Summary Rationale:

CADD and CAD are more up-to-date terms to describe the name of the discipline traditionally know as Drafting.

PROPOSAL #29

Proposed Revision Discipline: Certified Nursing Assistant
College: Los Angeles Harbor

Current Minimum Qualification:

Bachelor's degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience.

Health Care Ancillaries: Medical assisting, hospice worker, home care aide, certified nurse aide, health aide, ward clerk, central service technology, childbirth educator, primary care associate, massage therapy.

Proposed Change:

Health Care Ancillaries: Medical assisting, hospice worker, home care aide, ~~certified nurse aide~~, health aide, ward clerk, central service technology, childbirth educator, primary care associate, massage therapy.

Add *Certified Nursing Assistant:* Routine nursing services of patients in hospitals or long-term care facilities practiced under the direction of nursing or medical staff and specific to the nurse assistant’s certification examination. Includes Acute Care Nurse Assistant.

Summary Rationale:

The current Health Care Ancillaries list of areas as “also in the discipline” is unorganized and does not differentiate health care occupations for which state nursing certification is required from occupations such as message therapy and ward clerk that do not require certification. Certified Nursing Assistant requires state nursing certification.

PROPOSAL #30

Proposed Revision Discipline: Certified Nursing Assistant
College: Los Angeles Harbor

Current Minimum Qualification:

Bachelor’s degree **AND** two years of experience, **OR** any associate degree **AND** six years of experience.

Health Care Ancillaries: Medical assisting, hospice worker, home care aide, certified nurse aide, health aide, ward clerk, central service technology, childbirth educator, primary care associate, massage therapy.

Proposed Change:

Health Care Ancillaries: Medical assisting, hospice worker, ~~home care aide~~, certified nurse aide, health aide, ward clerk, central service technology, childbirth educator, primary care associate, massage therapy.

Add *Home Health Aide:* *Principles and techniques used to assist elderly, convalescent, or disabled patients in their homes by providing for their health care needs.*

Summary Rationale:

The current Health Care Ancillaries list of areas as “also in the discipline” is unorganized and does not differentiate health care occupations such as Home Health Aid (HHA) that requires state nursing certification is required from occupations such as message therapy

and ward clerk that do not require certification. HHA requires a BSN, RN and PH licensure and is governed by the Department of Health Service.

PROPOSAL #31

Proposed Revision Discipline: Geographic Information Systems (GIS)
College: Citrus College

Current Minimum Qualification:
None.

Proposed Change:
Bachelor's degree AND two years of experience, OR any associate degree AND six years of experience.

Summary Rationale:
GIS is an emerging field that is heavily used as an analysis tool in several disciplines. There are many individuals who have expertise in GIS but who do not necessarily have a degree specifically in this subject. Thus a combination of a relevant degree (such as Geography, Forestry, Planning, Climatology, Meteorology, or Computer Science) and expertise from experience and coursework should qualify them to teach courses in this area.

PROPOSAL #32

Proposed Revision Discipline: Administration of Justice
College: Los Angeles Harbor College

Current Minimum Qualification:
Bachelor's degree AND two years of experience, OR any associate degree AND six years of experience.

Proposed Change:
