- The MMAP team hosted a webinar on Thursday, March 7, titled "Spotlight on STEM Calculus 1: Impact of Preparatory Pathways on Completion."
 - This webinar shared new findings on the impact transfer-level preparatory courses in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) pathways have on students' chances of completing the first calculus course required for their major.

 Leadershifting: Virtual Professional Development Workshop Series New Ways of Seeing, Doing, and Leading from the Middle.
 - O This virtual workshop series starts on March 12 and provides leadership skills and knowledge building needed by community college professionals to lead change from the "middle" in community colleges. The workshops are based on research on effective leadership LFM curriculum and the insights and experiences of LFM alumni engaged in social and racial justice, inclusion, equity, and student success efforts. Many of the skills taught in these workshops are aligned with the American Association of Community Colleges' competencies for community college leaders.
 - The series includes six workshops, offered weekly on Tuesdays from 1:00-4:00 pm in March and April. You may sign up for individual workshops, a series of three workshops, or all six workshops. Mid-level administrators; counseling, instructional, full-time, and adjunct faculty; classified professionals; and institutional researchers and planners are invited to participate.
