I. Welcome and Introductions

IV. Statewide Updates – Dolores Davison, ASCCC Vice President

- ASCCC president John Stankas is making an effort to make other constituents aware of the activities of the ASCCC by including CIOs, student senate, and others in the president's updates.
- ASCCC is focused on four key areas: Guided Pathways and the impact on faculty; AB 705 implementation; and completing the Strong Workforce Task Force recommendations including credit for prior learning (CPL) and the role of CPL in the baccalaureate degrees. The final area of focus is faculty diversification. Planning is underway for a summit in Sacramento in January/February around faculty hiring. Three workshops are planned for BUtte, Bakersfield and Norco around faculty hiring.
- ASCCC Executive Committee is hiring a new Executive Director. The timeline is to have new ED in place in spring.
- ASCCC concluded Board of Governors (BOG) candidate interviews and sent five recommendations to Governor Brown at the end of September. There has been significant turnover lately in the BOG membership.
- ASCCC relations with the Chancellor are still strained, though progress is being made and relationships improving among members of the Chancellor's Office. There has been significant loss in the number of long-time employees. Most Vice Chancellors are new.

ASCCC has recently been asked to participate in a task force on the Student Centered Funding formula.

V. Academic Senate Foundation Report

Scholarships for the fall plenary are available for faculty in Areas C and D. Scholarship includes registration, two nights in hotel and travel costs.
